Electives (10 - 12 credits)

All students will need a minimum of 6 upper division (300-400/3000-4000 level) elective credits to meet the NMSU graduation requirement of 48 upper division credits. However, those students who take lower division language courses will need a minimum of 12 upper division elective credits to meet this requirement.

The College of Education requires a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 for graduation and a minimum grade of "C-" in all education courses, elective courses and English and Math courses meeting the NMSU Basic Skills requirement. Basic Skills must be met in order to take any upper division (300-400/3000-4000 level) course.

<u>Developmental Math and Developmental English courses are included on transcripts and will be calculated in the grade point</u> average, but do not count towards total degree credit hours.
