LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT FOR ECED (NON-LICENSURE) MAJORS (6-8 credits)

All ECED (Non-Licensure) majors must complete two semesters of language courses, preferably American Sign Language or Spanish. (However, if students have fluency in an Indigenous language or wish to take something different than Spanish or Sign Language, please see Director of ECED for permission and/or process). Students unfamiliar with Spanish should take SPAN 1110 and 1120, while heritage speakers should take SPAN 1210 and 1220. MINIMUM UPPER DIVISION REQUIRED (300+) 48

The College of Education requires a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75 for graduation and a minimum grade of “C-” in all education courses, elective courses and English and Math courses meeting the NMSU Basic Skills requirement. Basic Skills must be met in order to take any upper division (300-400/3000-4000 level) course.

Developmental Math and Developmental English courses are included on transcripts and will be calculated in the grade point average, but do not count towards total degree credit hours.

This degree plan is designed to meet all of the NMSU general education requirements listed in the undergraduate catalog. However, if a course substitution is granted for this degree plan, be aware that it might not apply to another program. Please see your advisor for assistance.
