SUBJECT: GRADUATE Competitive Admission to the Teacher Education Program

We value your interest in the Teacher Education Program (TEP) at New Mexico State University. All students who wish to complete a teaching degree must be admitted to the TEP. The College of Education (COE) has instituted a competitive TEP admission process that continues to ensure quality students become prepared teacher candidates. It is required that you submit a professional electronic portfolio as your application to the Teacher Education Program, which will be reviewed by the College of Education TEP faculty.

Education is a rewarding and challenging profession, and the faculty and staff of the college are eager to help you meet your goals. *The minimum cumulative GPA and NES Essential Academic Skills OR Praxis Core Academic Skills test scores* are necessary standards to be considered for admission to the TEP but do not ensure admission to the TEP. **A student who, in the professional judgment of the committee, does not meet the criteria for acceptance into the Teacher Education Program will be denied admission.** Therefore, the applicant is encouraged to achieve the highest possible cumulative GPA, develop a strong student portfolio, exemplify the dispositions necessary for the teaching field, and conduct a successful interview as outlined in the this packet.

Please read these information sheets carefully. Fully complete your portfolio and submit to the College of Education by the appropriate deadline. Portfolios that are incomplete or received past the due date will need to be resubmitted the following semester.

GRADUATE

MINIMUM CRITERIA IN ORDER TO SUBMIT A TEP PORTFOLIO:

1. The student must establish a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher at NMSU.
2. Students may submit their electronic portfolio during the semester in which they are enrolled in the last of the prerequisites. The student must earn a “B-” or better in the following TEP prerequisites:

3. The student must have passed the National Evaluation Series (NES) Essential Academic Skills Exams; Reading, Math, and Writing with a minimum score of **220** OR the Praxis Core Academic Skills Exams: Reading (passing score 156), Writing (passing score 162), and Math (passing score 150).

The State of NM has transitioned to the Praxis exams for Teacher Licensure. The State of NM and NMSU-TEP will accept tests from either NES or Praxis Jan. 2020-Dec. 21, 2020. The NES tests will not become invalid, but for tests dates after Dec. 21, 2020 the State of NM and NMSU-TEP will only accept Praxis.

4. The student must complete a Program of Study for Master’s Students form. Make an appointment with the Program Director to review, sign, and date. The student must retain a copy for the TEP online portfolio. The student then submits the original signed form to the TPAL administrative office for processing. PROCEDURE FOR ONLINE SUBMISSION IS AS FOLLOWS:

1. The Teacher Education Program will review online portfolios three times a year, in the Fall, Spring, and Summer. Given that you have met the criteria above, upload your completed portfolio to the Teacher Education Program portal **no later than noon (MST) on:**

- **3rd Friday in September for the Fall,**
- **3rd Friday in February for the Spring,**
- **3rd Friday in July for the Summer**

Confirm exact date by contacting the Teacher Education Program office at the beginning of each semester (646-2669).

2. The TEP faculty will conduct Teacher Candidate interviews 2-3 weeks after TEP submission. Notification of interview times will be sent via NMSU email. A portion of the interview will be based on the Dispositions Assessment completed by your EDUC 515 instructor. If this course during the same semester you are submitting your TEP application, it is the student’s responsibility to have the dispositions assessment completed prior to the scheduled interview.

- **A comprehensive review of a student’s dispositions will include the course instructor’s**

evaluation, dispositions exemplified during the interview, and during all pre-TEP courses.

3. Based on the student's ability to achieve the highest possible cumulative GPA, develop a strong student portfolio, exemplify the dispositions necessary for the teaching field, and conduct a successful interview as outlined in the this packet, students will receive a ***conditional*** letter to be able to register for TEP courses during registration and will receive an invitation to the NMSU Teacher Candidate Induction Ceremony into the TEP.
4. After final verification of the successful completion of all TEP pre-requisites (listed above), student will be fully admitted to TEP.
5. If a student is not successful with one or more of the admission criteria, the TEP Directors will notify the student in writing via NMSU email.
 - **If a student does not meet the criteria for entrance into TEP, they will only have 1 additional semester to apply. If a student does not meet the criteria after two TEP submissions, they will not be invited to reapply.**

NOTE: Graduate students cannot continue in designated Teacher Education Program METHODS courses until they have been admitted to the TEP. You must be admitted to TEP to be able to register for the following:

- Early Childhood TEP Designated Courses: RDG 550, ECED 540, SPED 550, RDG 551, ECED 520, ECED 570, ECED 470*, SPED 483* (*Student Teaching Courses also require STEP admittance)
- Elementary TEP Designated Courses: RDG 560, RDG 561, EDUC 551, EDUC 552, EDUC 554, EDUC 509*, EDUC 510* (*Student Teaching Courses also require STEP admittance)
- Special Education TEP Designated Courses: SPED 548, SPED 582* (*Student Teaching Courses also required STEP admittance)
- Secondary TEP Designated Courses: EDUC 56x, RDG 514, EDUC 509*, EDUC 510* (*Student Teaching Courses also require STEP admittance)
- K-12 Physical Education TEP Designated Courses: PEP 466, EDUC 509*, EDUC 510* (*Student Teaching Courses also require STEP admittance)

NOTICE: If you are accepted into TEP but do not start your TEP Block Methods Courses within one year, or if you take a semester off from your courses after being admitted into TEP, then you will be required to reapply.
