Protocol for Review of Materials for Consideration of Admissions and Official Acceptance to the Alternative Licensure Process

- 1. Admission to NMSU as a graduate student is required. Students must complete the application for regular graduate admission at: http://prospective.nmsu.edu/graduate/apply/index.htm
- 2. The following must be uploaded to your NMSU application:
 - a. Transcripts that reflect at least a 3.0 GPA
 - b. Resume
 - c. Letter of Intent (Include interest in alternative licensure)
 - d. GREs not required, upload paper stating "GREs not required for alternative licensure"
 - e. 3 letters of recommendations (go to #3 below for information)
 - f. Contract of Eligibility for full-time teaching position in "other documents"
- 3. Go to http://spedcd.education.nmsu.edu/ and click on "SPED masters admission application procedure" for more information.

NMSU begins a REVIEW OF MATERIALS FOR CONSIDERATION OF ADMISSIONS after all the required documentations have been received, AND an evaluation of transcripts has been performed by NMSU.

Special Education Alternative Licensure Process subject area credits required:

BA degree including 30 credit hours (total) of the coursework below: A minimum of 3 credit hours per each of the subjects below is required (24) plus an additional 6 credits of any combination to equal a total of (30) credits and an additional 24-36 credit hours in a teaching field if the student is pursuing a Special Education + Secondary Education License.
